



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Claim registration period is NOT OPEN

Calculated Compensation

Question 1. How is my compensation calculated?

If the Claims Administrator assesses your Claim as eligible, the Claims Administrator will calculate your compensation using the formula in the Claims Administration Procedure which is based on the CSA Base Amount that your CFS Agency(s) would have received while you were a child-in-care and for the number of months of your Placement(s) at the CFS Agency(s).

The first payment you will receive is referred to as the Settlement Payment which represents 85% of your calculated compensation. Nine months after the end of the Claims Registration Period, depending on if there are any remaining Settlement Funds after all the Settlement Payments have been made, you may receive an Additional Payment. The Additional Payment may include up to the 15% balance of your calculated compensation, your share of the interest earned on the Settlement Fund and an additional 25% of your calculated compensation.

Question 2. Am I guaranteed to receive compensation?

No. The Claims Administrator uses the court-approved Claims Administration Procedure to assess a Claimant's eligibility and/or the amount the Claimant may be compensated based on the evidence provided by the CFS Agency and/or the Claimant.

Question 3. What if I was a Child-in-Care for less than one month?

If the Claims Administrator assesses your Claim as eligible, the Claims Administration Procedure provides a one-time payment of \$150 if all of an Eligible Claimant's placements were less than 30 days each during the Class Period.

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Question 4. What happens if an individual's CFS records cannot be found?

In cases where placement records are incomplete or cannot be verified, the Claims Administrator will make reasonable efforts to determine eligibility and award compensation. In special circumstances, a deemed amount of time in care may be applied based on available evidence.
