



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Claim registration period is NOT OPEN

Class Members

Question 1. Who Qualifies for Compensation?

Only individuals identified as Class Members are eligible. A Class Member is defined as a child (or former child) who was a provincially funded Child-in-Care under the care of a Manitoba CFS Agency between January 1, 2005, and March 31, 2019. Other individuals who may submit claims on behalf of Class Members include:

- Legal guardians
- Executors or Administrators of estates for deceased Class Members.
- Power of Attorney holders.
- Public Guardian and Trustee.
- The CFS Agency with care and control of the child during the Class Period.

Question 2. How do I know if I can be part of the Class Action Settlement?

The Class Action Settlement is for Provincially Funded current and former children-in-care (Child-in-Cares) of Indigenous and Non-Indigenous CFS Agencies between January 1, 2005, and March 31, 2019.

The Claims Administrator does not have the list of those Children-in-Care who were Provincially Funded yet. Once the Claims Registration Period opens and if you submit a claim, then the Claims Administrator will communicate with you if you are eligible for compensation as a Provincially Funded Child-in-Care.

In the meanwhile, you may consider contacting your current or former CFS Agency to determine if you were Provincially Funded.



FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Claim registration period is NOT OPEN

Question 3. What if I was a Child-in-Care before January 1, 2005 or after March 31, 2019?

If you were not a Child-in-Care between January 1, 2005 and March 31, 2019, then you are not eligible for compensation.

Question 4. What if I was a Child-in-Care straddling the beginning or ending dates?

If you were a Child-in-Care that overlapped either January 1, 2005 or March 31, 2019 periods, you will only be potentially eligible for compensation during the time you were a Child-in-Care between January 1, 2005 and March 31, 2019.
